## Liturgy of the Word with Children

We have been celebrating *Liturgy of the Word with Children* at Mass almost every Sunday all year 'round since 1995. It is a wonderful opportunity for young children to experience the Word of God on their own level. So if you have been wondering where the kids are going at 10:00 Mass and what's it all about, here it is.

- Who** Children in Pre-K through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade.  
*They need to be able to understand and participate.*
- When** Sunday mornings at the 10:00 Mass most of the year (*they don't meet on Easter Sunday and Christmas*).
- What** The Liturgy of the Word that the children celebrate follows the same structure as the adults: *First Reading, Responsorial Psalm, Gospel, Reflection on the readings, a Profession of Faith and Intercessions*. The readings that the children hear are the same ones that their families will hear, but are in a language that children can better understand. The leaders (there are always two and they all have their clearances) will invite their participation in reflecting on the readings, and the Creed and the Intercessions are done in a way that the children can comprehend and participate in also. They also receive a handout to take home regarding that Sunday's readings so that the children can discuss them with their families.
- How** Children are welcome to join the group at any time. There is no need to register and there is no fee involved. The children gather as usual with their families in church. After the Opening Prayer, the presider will invite any children who wish to take part to come forward. They will process from the church into the Findlay Room. This meeting room is directly behind the choir area. The children will return to their families during the Preparation of the Gifts.

If a child is reluctant to participate because of shyness or is unsure about where the children go when they leave the Church, Mrs. Flynn or one of the leaders would be glad to show a family the room before or after the 10:00 Mass.

A parent is also welcome to come with their child the first time so that they are more comfortable. If you have any questions at all, please call Rebecca Flynn at the rectory, 456-6256 .
